How Are We Funded?

Our main source of income is from fees from our clients. For that fee, we deliver a hot lunch and a bagged meal 5 days a week. Additional sources of income are as follows:

- Donations from local service organizations.
- Donations from local businesses and industry.
- Donations from private citizens and families in memory of former clients and/or volunteers.



We receive NO FUNDING from national, state or local governments,* nor are we affiliated with any state or national Meals on Wheels organizations.

* Some clients who qualify have their fees paid by the Office of the Aging.



With the exception of one part-time paid Kitchen Manager, Lititz Meals on Wheels is staffed entirely by volunteers!

We Provide A Hot Lunch And A Bagged Meal 5 Days A Week!

For one low fee, our clients receive a hot lunch and a bagged meal 5 days a week, Monday through Friday. Hot lunch includes a main entree and two sides. The bagged meal includes a variety of sandwiches, snacks, fruit, salads, freshly made desserts, and milk.

Hot lunch items are prepared fresh daily by our volunteer cooks and kitchen staff following "ServSafe" food preparation procedures. Menus are rotated and changed regularly to assure clients a variety of beef, pork, poultry, fish, and tasty casseroles. Our menus are approved by the Office of the Aging for their nutritional value.

Our protein items come from various distributors that serve the restaurant industry, and we strive to use local vendors for fresh fruits, vegetables and snack items whenever possible.

Client Eligibility

- 1. Client must be a resident with a permanent address within the Warwick School District. Residents of retirement communities, where meals are available from the facility, are not eligible.
- 2. Client must be unable to prepare nutritious meals for themselves on a daily basis.
- 3. Client must have financial ability to meet current fee, or have fee paid by another party or the Office of the Aging. Donations are used at the discretion of Meals on Wheels to help clients in need of financial assistance.

General Information

A **Board of Directors** meets six times a year to assure the organization is functioning smoothly and discusses ways to improve and update our client services.

Sub-committees meet regularly to be sure kitchen duties, driver schedules and routes, billing procedures, and all aspects of our service are running efficiently.

Meal Delivery is made Monday through Friday between 10:30 am and 12 Noon. There is no delivery on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving day, and Christmas Day.

More than 150 volunteers are currently active with Lititz Meals on Wheels. *New volunteers are always welcome!*

Donations are used to improve our service and to provide assistance to clients requiring financial aid. We are a non-profit organization and **all donations** are tax deductible.
